We have now settled on what our fully completed shed will look like - 24m long by 9m wide, clad with timber and accommodating a large workshop area, crib room, storage shed, basic kitchen, accessible toilet and an outdoor area. These plans were submitted to Clarence Council for a Preliminary Planning Assessment and we've received advice that it meets all requirements. The next step is to obtain an acoustic report which will go with the formal Development Application to Council.

This is a big project and now the main task moves on to how we achieve our objective.

Given the large amount of funds required for a complete build first up, it may be that a staged construction becomes necessary. By taking the staging approach we have a much better chance of having a Shed to move into earlier and once we are in a shed, opportunities for fundraising, and further grant applications to complete the other stage(s) will improve.

Discussions with Council and potential funders will commence in earnest in the New Year.

If we do stage the construction, we will always retain the objective of the current plans and build each stage with the view to extending in accordance with that objective.
