
Early bird bookings are now available for members and guests, general marketing of the event will start next week. Numbers are limited and bookings essential. Last year we had a waiting list to attend!

## **AGM Report**

The President's position was vacant having received no nominations. Robin agreed to continue in the role until a replacement could be found. This was ratified at a subsequent committee meeting.

# **Funding update**

Our current bank balance has jumped to \$90,711 with the receipt of \$53,000 plus GST from the State Government.

This is an update on our other grant opportunities:

- Our grant application to the federal Building Better Regions grant scheme has been successful adding another \$80,626 to our available funds. We now enter the Grant Deed agreement which, once signed by us and the Federal department, I expect will allow funding to flow next year.
- Our application to Tas Community Fund (TCF) Infrastructure Grants was submitted but unfortunately
  was unsuccessful. This was always going to be a tough one as they received submissions for over
  \$15m for the available funds of \$1.5m.

From a funding point of view, we are now in a position to build at the Calverton Oval site.

It would come as no surprise that our alcohol intake needs to be limited.
